



Texas Eagle Forum Statement on the November 5th Election

We weigh everything we do at TEF against God's Word and the Constitution. We believe that strong families are the backbone of a free and thriving society. We study the issues that impact the people and families of Texas and weigh in on legislation depending on how the citizens of our state will be affected by it.

We follow the same guidelines when evaluating candidates and political parties. TEF stands for the same principles as the Republican Party of Texas. The platform supports our Founders principles, Judeo-Christian values, the right to life for innocent babies in the womb, protecting children from sexualization, and keeping Texas free from predatory gambling and legalized drugs. The RPT platform supports a border closed to illegal crossers, lower taxes, U.S. autonomy, leaving the UN and WHO, property rights, and 2nd amendment rights, among other ideals that support self-responsibility.

On the Left side, the Democrat Party throws out some lofty-sounding ideals but they all include DEI, CRT, victimhood, justice, equity, etc. They are happy to kill babies in the womb at the will of a would-be-mother. They are happy to sterilize and mutilate young children, expose them to sexual ideas and ideology, take parental rights from good parents, take as much money as they can from those who work hard for their own family, let our nation be controlled by the WHO and the UN, and let our state be run by the federal government ... the list of differences goes on and on. Personal statement from Cindi Castilla, President of Texas Eagle Forum

I will be voting for every Republican on my ballot. The time I have spent working on issues in the Capitol has helped me understand that Republicans won't all do the right thing all the time. Many will be with us much of the time but we will work to change the hearts and minds of those who stand on what we know is the wrong side of an issue.

We can have a conversation with them because they do claim to support the conservative ideals in the RPT platform. The Democrats on my ballot will likely not align with us on more than a couple of issues if any.

I am voting on Election Day. Every morning, reports are generated listing who voted in each precinct using electronic poll books.
