Dear Texas Eagles,

The media headlines were all variations on the same theme: Turnout for Texas primaries smashed recent records! Joy and elation seemed to abound over the fact that one-in-four Texans voted in the primaries. But I am confused. Out of 18.7 million registered voters, barely 4.5 million actually voted either during early voting (2.9 million) or on March 6th (1.6 million). How can we be happy that a mere 24% of eligible voters decided who will be on the November ballot for everyone else?

I can't help but think of a local volunteer I had the chance to meet - a wonderful patriot, newer to the Conservative movement - who was asked last-minute to serve as an Election Judge for an unmanned Republican polling location. He agreed and gave-up his weekend to take classes in order to be eligible. He sacrificed so that others could exercise their right to vote. But then his polling location only received about 25% of the voters they expected. I love that he jumped in, but how I wish the voters assigned to his location showed up at 100% to give his sacrifice more meaning. I understand that life happens, and we almost all have an election we have missed for an unexpected reason, but when I look at the numbers, it is clear that there is still much work to be done to help people appreciate the importance of their participation in our government.

Still, there is cause for some celebration. Republican voters overwhelmingly supported Prop. 10 "Texas Should Ban Sharia Law" with 95% voting affirmative. This will send a strong message to all Republican candidates that Texans mean business. Indeed, the most important issue we are facing is the rapid and intentional rise of Islam in Texas.

I have been in many meetings and strategy sessions with federal and state elected officials and other grassroots warriors planning the fight against the Islamization of Texas. One consistent theme is that voters and elected officials both want more information on Islam and the true scope of the problems we are facing here in Texas.

That is why we have decided to produce a two-part *Torch* series on Islam. This month's issue takes a deep dive into Islam as a religion and ideology. Next month, we are going to take a hard look at the Islamification that is already happening in far too many communities around Texas. Understanding Islam and its History

The following article is the first in a two-part series on Islam in Texas.

Two billion people in the world today practice Islam. That's one-in-four. Most of the world's nearly 50 Muslim-majority countries are governed according to Islamic principles, customs, and laws; 57 countries are members of the global Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). Virtually all major Western countries rely on oil from Islamic countries and pursue liberal immigration policies encouraging Muslim migration into the West. As a result of those policies, many Texas communities, educational institutions, and companies are experiencing unprecedented growth in their Muslim populations.

But how much do we know about Islam, its beliefs, values, and history? Would a survey of Islam show a religion aligned or at-odds with Western values? Does Islam recognize a separation between religion and politics? Would the history of Islam show a pattern of coexistence or conquest?

Many well-meaning people wish to avoid the appearance of being prejudicial, so they opt instead for loosely held opinions which, in reality, amount to little more than untested assumptions and wishful thinking. They assume that mutual respect, common decency, and peaceful tolerance are universally-shared values.



Such assumptions might be beneficial on a day-to-day personal level. But when well-intended assumptions, unchecked by reality, become the basis for our political and policy decisions rather than truth, we can soon find ourselves facing the harsh consequences of ignorance.

This two-part series explores the impact Muslim migration is having on Texas. In Part One, we begin with a survey of Islam and its history. Part Two will expose the current situation in Texas as a result of the state's growing population of unassimilated Muslims, and outline the important steps we must take to protect our state, communities, and families.

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A Survey of Islam and its History

The religion of Islam was established in the 7th century by Mohammed, an Arab man who lived in what is today Saudi Arabia. Born in Mecca in 570AD, orphaned as a toddler, and cared for by poor bedouins in the Arabian desert, Mohammed claimed to have his first mystical experience as a young child. (His foster mother believed the child was demon-possessed.) When he was in his early 20s, Mohammed married into a wealthy family of a powerful tribe, the Quraysh.

In 610AD, at age 40, Mohammed claimed the angel Gabriel visited him in the cave of Hira, gave him the power to read and write, and declared him to be the “Messenger of Allah and the Seal of the Prophets” (the last prophet) on a mission to restore worship of *Allah* (god) throughout the world. *Islam* is an Arabic word that can be literally translated as “submission.” *Muslim* is a cognate of Islam meaning “one who submits.” Mohammed’s early followers were among the slaves, poor, and oppressed of Mecca.

The sacred text of Islam is the *Quran* (“recitation”), a collection of 114 revelations supposedly given to Mohammed by Gabriel from Allah. Each revelation corresponds to one chapter (*sura*) in the Quran (Q). The suras are organized by the number of verses (*ayahs*), longest to shortest, rather than chronologically. In Islamic teaching, the Quran supplants previous holy scriptures, namely the Law of Moses, the Psalms of David, and the *Injil* – the Gospels. Where the Quran contradicts the Bible, Muslims believe the Quran is correct. Additional teachings from Mohammed on proper ways of living were collected by his companions (*Sahaba*) and compiled in the *Hadith*, which Islamic scholars use as the basis for Islamic society and law (*Sharia*). Today, Sharia law is either the primary or significant source of law in 30 countries, including Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Indonesia.

For nearly a decade, Mohammed’s influence in Mecca continued to grow. But when his wife died in 619AD, Mohammed lost the protection his advantageous marriage had afforded him. In 622AD, he and his followers fled north from persecution to the Jewish city of Yathrib (present-day Medina) where Mohammed established his *caliphate* (Islamic nation), slaughtered 800 Jewish men, confiscated their property, and took women and children as slaves. Known as the original *hijrah* (migration), this is considered the beginning of Islam as an organized religion and is year zero of the Islamic calendar (*hijri*; 2026AD corresponds to 1447/8AH).

Today, *hijrah* is the religious obligation on Muslims to migrate to Muslim countries from non-Muslim countries if they are not able to openly practice their religion (Q.4:97). For those who choose to remain, however, several hadiths forbid them from integrating into non-Muslim society. “Whoever settles in the lands of the non-Muslims, celebrates their festivals, and imitates them, and then dies whilst in that state will be gathered with them (i.e. counted as a non-believer) on the Day of Resurrection” (*The Truthful Script*, Book One of the Hadith). Muslim theologian Ibn al-Qayyim warned: “[Congratulating non-Muslims on their Christian or secular holidays] is as grave a sin as... murdering someone, or having illicit sexual relations. Whoever congratulates a person on his disobedience to Allah... imperils himself to the wrath... of Allah.”

Early on, Mohammed gave the appearance of welcoming diversity: “Let there be no compulsion in religion” (Q.2:256). But this liberality of mind quickly gave way to much harsher attitudes towards people who refused to convert. “Fight and slay the idolaters wherever you find them... besiege them... lie in wait for them” (Q.9:5). Mohammed also took a hard line on those who resisted Islamic control. “The punishment of those who wage war against Allah and His Apostle, and strive with might... for mischief through the land is: execution, or crucifixion, or the cutting off of hands and feet from opposite sides, or exile from the land” (Q.5:33). Indeed, early Muslims believed it was their sacred duty to murder anyone who refused to submit to Islamic conquerors (Q.2:216; 9:29).



It is a common misconception that Muslims and Christians believe in the same God, but the Quran makes it clear that this is not so. According to Walter Martin, “The Muslim God is unapproachable by sinful man... [He] is a god of judgment, not grace; a god of wrath, rather than love. The Muslim’s desire is to submit to the point where he can hold back the judging arm of Allah and, perhaps through the capricious whim of Allah, inherit eternal life in an earthly paradise of gluttony and sexual gratification” (*The Kingdom of the Cults*, pg. 366).

The Quran teaches that Jesus Christ is not the Son of God, but rather a prophet of Allah (Q.4:171), who did not die but was taken to heaven in bodily form (Q.4:157). These claims directly contradict the historical facts of the Gospel. In the Quran, Jews are called people “who will listen to any lie” (Q.5:41), and anyone who believes Jesus is God is an infidel (Q.5:73) and an enemy (Q.5:14). The Quran even forbids Muslims from having Jewish or Christian friends (Q.5:51).

After consolidating his power in Medina, Mohammed conquered Mecca in 630AD, solidifying Muslim control of Arabia. For the next century, Islam continued to spread by the sword across the Middle East, parts of India, the north of Africa, and even into Europe (modern-day Sicily and Spain), where Christians were forced to pay a *jizya* (tax on non-believers) in exchange for limited freedom as second-class citizens (*dhimmi*). This two-tiered society included such restrictions on Christians as: forbidding the new construction or restoration of churches; public displays of faith (e.g. ringing church bells, erecting crosses); proselytizing; preventing the conversion to Islam of a family member or friend; dressing like a Muslim; carrying weapons or riding horses. If a Christian broke any of the laws against them, Muslims “are allowed to do [to them] what [they] are allowed [to do] to people of defiance (*kafir*) and rebellion” (Pact of Umar, 634AD), which is to say, kill them.

Mohammed’s personal life was as tumultuous as his empire. He committed multiple transgressions against the Quran he helped write, but, in every instance, Mohammed claimed Allah gave him special dispensation (Q.33:36-40). For example, even though the Quran limits the number of wives to four (Q.4:3), Mohammed had thirteen wives, several of which were either war widows or women taken from conquered Arab and Jewish tribes. Mohammed even took his daughter-in-law for a wife (forbidden, Q.4:31), after his son was killed.

But not all of Mohammed’s choices in wives went against the Quran. At age 50, Mohammed took six-year old Aisha as a bride and consummated the marriage when she was only nine (permitted, Q.65:4). Mohammed also had two sex slaves (permitted, Q.4:34; 23:5-6), including a Jewish captive named Rayhana, and Maria, an Egyptian Coptic (Christian). With the exception of his first wife,



Khadija, with whom he was monogamous for over 20 years, Mohammed’s polygamous marriages were the results of his military conquests and consolidation of power in Arabia.

Following Mohammed’s death in 632AD, Islam split into two major branches, Shi’i and Sunni, over the succession of legitimate *caliphs* (leaders). For Shia Muslims (i.e. Shi’ite), Mohammed’s son-in-law and fourth caliph Ali is the first in a line of *imams* (spiritual leaders) that ended with the twelfth imam, who disappeared in 878AD. Shias believe *al-Mahdi*, the Hidden Imam, will return as a messianic figure and usher in a golden age of Islam before the destruction of the world. Until then, they look to an *ayatollah* (cleric) for spiritual authority. Worldwide, the Shia population is estimated to be between 150-200 million. Iran is the largest Shia country. Other Muslim countries with significant Shia populations include Bahrain, Iraq, Lebanon, Pakistan, and Yemen.

90% of Muslims in the world (1.7-1.8 billion) are Sunni, the largest religious denomination in the world. Sunni Muslims view Shia Islam with suspicion. Some Sunni scholars portray Shia Muslims as heretics, a characterization which has fueled sectarian violence in Islamic countries. Nearly every major Islamic terrorist group to make recent headlines in the West is Sunni: Al-Qaeda, ISIS, Boko Haram, the Taliban, the Muslim Brotherhood, and Al-Shabaab.

In the late 19th century, a strict fundamentalist movement arose within Sunni Islam known as Salafism, which aimed at a renewal of Muslim life through Sharia Law, and the restoration of the caliphate through political influence and *jihad* (holy war). Today, Salafism is the fastest growing Islamic movement, representing an estimated 12% of Sunnis worldwide. Saudi Arabia is the center of the Salafist movement and, along with Qatar, is the primary source of funding for spreading its influence around the world. ➔

In its obituary, Khamenei is remembered for living "modestly in a home-office complex where he met with heads of state in a sparsely furnished room with a beige carpet, a sofa and a few wooden chairs."
